MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN THE STATE OF ALABAMA DEPARTMENT OF FINANCE AND THE ALABAMA FOOD BANK ASSOCIATION FOR THE DISTRIBUTION OF CARES ACT CORONAVIRUS RELIEF FUNDS

This Memorandum of Understanding is made by and between the State of Alabama Department of Finance, at 600 Dexter Avenue, Montgomery, Alabama 36130, hereinafter referred to as "DOF" and the Alabama Food Bank Association, an Alabama nonprofit corporation (that is qualified as a public charity under Section 501(c)(3), Section 509(a), and Section 170(b)(1)(A)(vi) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended), at 2000 Vernon Avenue Southwest, Huntsville, Alabama 35805, hereinafter referred to as "ALFBA." DOF and ALFBA are hereinafter collectively referred to as the "parties." This agreement becomes effective upon approval of the parties and the Governor.

1. PURPOSE AND SCOPE

- (a) The federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act, hereinafter referred to as the CARES Act, established the Coronavirus Relief Fund, hereinafter referred to as CRF. The CARES Act appropriated \$150,000,000,000 to the CRF to make payments to state, local, and tribal governments for the purposes enumerated in the CARES Act, namely to respond to and mitigate the coronavirus pandemic. The State of Alabama received approximately \$1,900,000,000 from the CRF. CRF funds may only be used to cover costs that 1) are necessary expenditures incurred due to the public health emergency with respect to the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID–19); 2) were not accounted for in the budget most recently approved as of March 27, 2020 (the date of enactment of the CARES Act) for the State or government; and 3) were incurred during the period that begins on March 1, 2020, and ends on December 30, 2020.
- (b) Alabama Act 2020-199 divided the State of Alabama's share of CRF funds into ten categories and charged DOF with the responsibility of administering the funds on behalf of the people of Alabama. One such category provides, "Up to \$300,000,000 to be used to support citizens, businesses, and non-profit and faith-based organizations of the state directly impacted by the coronavirus pandemic." ALFBA is requesting, and DOF is agreeing to provide, \$3,606,104.12 from this category of CRF funds to support ALFBA's "Alabama Feeding Initiative" as described in the budgets attached hereto as Appendix A.
- (c) In sum, ALFBA's Alabama Feeding Initiative will assist participating food banks to meet the increased demand for food due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The participating food banks include the Community Food Bank of Central Alabama, the Food Bank of North Alabama, the Montgomery Area Food Bank, the West Alabama Food Bank, the Food Bank of East Alabama, the Wiregrass Area Food Bank, the Selma Area Food Bank, and Feeding the Gulf Coast. Funds provided under this agreement will be used to reimburse the food banks for the following COVID-related expenses: 1) the purchase of food, packaging, and related supplies to meet increased demand; 2) for operational expenses, included fuel and maintenance, incurred due to handling a higher amount of food and hold open-air distribution events; 3) for rental cost of storage space and vehicles to handle increased volumes of food; and 4) to purchase PPE, screening equipment, and decontamination services to prevent the spread of COVID-19.

(d) As this project has been presented to DOF by ALFBA, DOF has concluded the Alabama Feeding Initiative is necessary to respond to and mitigate the coronavirus pandemic in Alabama. Further, DOF concludes that funding this project using the State's CRF funds is an appropriate use of these funds under both federal and state law. DOF fully supports ALFBA in its efforts to support and protect the citizens of Alabama.

II. PARTIES' RESPONSIBILITIES

A. ALFBA agrees to the following:

- 1. To develop, implement, and administer its Alabama Feeding Initiative as described in Section I.(c) above and on the budget as described in Appendix A;
- 2. To use the funds provided by DOF under this agreement in accordance with federal and state law and for the purposes set forth in this agreement and for no other purpose;
- 3. To provide to the State Finance Director's Office, by December 15, 2020, a report detailing the progress made on the implementation of the project; and
- 4. To return any funds provided by DOF under this agreement that are unspent as of December 30, 2020.

B. DOF agrees to the following:

1. To provide \$3,606,104.12 to ALFBA from the State's CRF funds as described herein to fund ALFBA's proposed Alabama Feeding Initiative and for no other purpose.

III. Financial Arrangements

The parties agree that approximately fourteen days after the effective date of this agreement, DOF will provide funding in the amount of \$3,606,104.12 under this agreement to be used for the purposes described herein. ALFBA acknowledges that all funds provided under this agreement must be spent or returned to DOF by December 30, 2020. Reimbursements may not occur after that date.

IV. TERMINATION OF AGREEMENT

Except as set forth in this section, this agreement may be terminated only by a writing signed by each party or representatives of each party. If ALFBA determines that it will not pursue this project for whatever reason, it may terminate this agreement upon written notice to the State Finance Director and upon return of any unspent funds. If DOF concludes, after a reasonable investigation and in its sole discretion as administrator of the funds, that the funds provided hereunder have been used in a manner inconsistent with federal or state law, DOF may terminate this agreement immediately upon written notice to ALFBA.

IV. MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- A. The terms and commitments contained herein shall not constitute a debt of the State of Alabama, which is prohibited by Section 213 of the Official Recompilation of the Constitution of Alabama, 1901, as amended by Amendment No. 26.
- B. By signing this contract, the contracting parties affirm, for the duration of the agreement, that they will not violate federal immigration law or knowingly employ, hire for employment, or continue to employ an unauthorized alien within the State of Alabama. Furthermore, a contracting party found to be in violation of this provision shall be deemed in breach of the agreement and shall be responsible for all damages resulting therefrom.
- C. In the event of any dispute between the parties, senior officials of both parties shall meet and engage in a good faith attempt to resolve the dispute. Should that effort fail, and the dispute involves the payment of money, a party's sole remedy is the filing of a claim with the Board of Adjustment of the State of Alabama. For any and all other disputes arising under the terms of this contract which are not resolved by negotiation, the parties agree to utilize appropriate forms of non-binding alternative dispute resolution including, but not limited to, mediation. Such dispute resolution shall occur in Montgomery, Alabama, utilizing where appropriate, mediators selected from the roster of mediators maintained by the Center for Dispute Resolution of the Alabama State Bar.
- D. DOF and ALFBA understand the unprecedented and novel challenge that COVID-19 presents to the State and its educational institutions. Therefore, ALFBA cannot guarantee the success of its efforts under this Memorandum of Understanding. In addition to the reporting requirements in Section II.A.3., ALFBA will reasonably update DOF of material changes that make ALFBA's performance hereunder impracticable.
- E. In order to comply with federal requirements relating to the administration of grants and other federal assistance funds, DOF provides the following information to ALFBA: This subaward is provided to ALFBA through a grant to the State of Alabama in the amount of \$1,901,262,000 from the U.S. Treasury via Section 601(a)(1) of the Social Security Act (42 U.S.C. 301 et seq.), known as the Coronavirus Relief Fund, as created by Section 5001 of the CARES Act, Pub. L. No. 116-136 (March 27, 2020) under Federal Award Identification Number SLT0002 and SLT0223, CFDA #21.019 Coronavirus Relief Fund for the period March 1, 2020 to December 30, 2020. This subaward is provided in accordance with the requirements set forth in the CARES Act and other applicable federal and state law and policy, and ALFBA affirms that all information it has provided to DOF relating to this subaward is true and accurate. This subaward does not include research and development. The parties acknowledge and understand that each subrecipient of CRF funds will be evaluated in accordance with Code of Federal Regulations 200-331(b) for risk of noncompliance with federal statutes, regulations, and the terms and conditions of the subaward. Further, each subrecipients' activities will be monitored as necessary to ensure that the subaward is used for authorized purposes, in compliance with law, and that subaward performance goals are achieved. Other monitoring tools may be implemented depending on the level of risk posed by the subrecipient.

V. AMENDMENT

This agreement may be amended only by a writing signed by each party or representatives of each party.
