IN THIS REPORT

- Our latest definitive ranking of America's most popular senators, led by Bernie Sanders of Vermont for the second quarter
 in a row.
 - The irascible independent is joined in the top 10 by one new face: Chris Murphy of Connecticut, whose entrance knocks newly elected Senate Republican leader John Thune of South Dakota down the rankings.
 - John Barrasso of Wyoming ranks just behind Sanders for the second quarter in a row after previously topping the list for a little over a year. Delegations from states with small populations and strong partisan leans are heavily represented in the top 10, continuing a long-term trend we observe in our rankings.
- Our latest definitive ranking of America's most unpopular senators, topped by Mitch McConnell of Kentucky for the 16th consecutive quarter.
 - Only three other senators Deb Fischer of Nebraska and Ted Cruz of Texas, who were just re-elected in November,
 and Ron Johnson of Wisconsin have higher disapproval ratings than approval ratings.
 - That trio is joined in the top 10 by Tammy Baldwin of Wisconsin, who just narrowly secured re-election, and Jon Tester
 of Montana and Sherrod Brown of Ohio, who were ousted.
 - Looking to the 2026 midterm elections, Susan Collins of Maine is the lone vulnerable incumbent up for re-election next year who ranks among America's 10 most unpopular senators.



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


