3 NAMING THE STATE OFFICE BUILDING AT 501 WASHINGTON AVENUE IN  
4 MONTGOMERY THE KAY IVEY OFFICE BUILDING.

6 WHEREAS, Alabama's 54th governor, Kay Ellen Ivey, is  
7 the longest continuously serving governor in state history  
8 and the longest-serving female governor in American history;  
9 and

10 WHEREAS, Governor Ivey grew up in the small town of  
11 Camden, in Wilcox County, the only child of Boadman Nettles  
12 Ivey and Barbara Elizabeth Ivey, who instilled in her the  
13 values of hard work, faith, family, and community; and

14 WHEREAS, after volunteering for Lurleen B. Wallace's  
15 successful 1966 gubernatorial campaign and concluding an  
16 effective four-year career in student government at her  
17 beloved Auburn University, Governor Ivey embarked on a  
18 career that began in the classroom as a high school history  
19 and English teacher and continued through service as a bank  
20 officer, Assistant Director of the Alabama Development  
21 Office, Reading Clerk of the Alabama House of  
22 Representatives, Government Affairs Director for the Alabama  
23 Commission on Higher Education, State Treasurer (2003-2011),  
24 and Lieutenant Governor (2011-2017); and

25 WHEREAS, following the resignation of her  
26 predecessor, then-Lieutenant Governor Kay Ivey became  
27 Governor Kay Ivey when she took the oath of office at 6:01  
28 p.m. on April 10, 2017, in the Old Senate Chamber of the

29 State Capitol, leading her to say, "Most governors have  
30 three months to prepare; I had three hours"; and

31 WHEREAS, newly installed Governor Ivey not only  
32 succeeded at "steading the ship of state" after years of  
33 tumult in Alabama state government but also wracked up an  
34 unprecedented series of accomplishments through her quiet  
35 but persistent, collaborative, and deliberate leadership;  
36 and

37 WHEREAS, as Alabama's economic-development governor,  
38 Governor Ivey presided over a state economy that  
39 consistently ranked in the top 10 states nationally both for  
40 its business climate and for in-migration, as evidenced by  
41 the investment of \$69 billion (billion with a "B") in new  
42 capital investments and the creation of over 100,000 new  
43 jobs; and

44 WHEREAS, as Alabama's infrastructure governor,  
45 Governor Ivey's signature Rebuild Alabama program led to the  
46 investment of more than \$2 billion in upgrades to Alabama's  
47 roads and bridges, funding some 500 vital road and bridge  
48 projects in all 67 Alabama counties, an initiative  
49 paralleled by a similar deployment of over \$2.5 billion to  
50 ensure universal access to high-speed, broadband Internet  
51 across Alabama, and which is complemented by her directing  
52 over \$900 million to support water infrastructure projects  
53 throughout the state; and

54 WHEREAS, as Alabama's education governor, Governor  
55 Ivey's tenure has seen Alabama skyrocket in national  
56 rankings; for example, the state has moved from dead last to

57 32nd in fourth-grade math and 34th in fourth-grade reading  
58 through the implementation of the Literacy and Numeracy  
59 Acts, Governor Ivey's Strong Start, Strong Finish  
60 initiative, the statewide expansion of the Dolly Parton  
61 Imagination Library, the passage of the state's highest-ever  
62 education budgets, including best-in-the-region teacher  
63 salaries, and the banning of cell phones in public K-12  
64 classrooms, all while authoring and championing the state's  
65 adoption of universal school choice through her landmark  
66 CHOOSE Act; and

67 WHEREAS, as Alabama's public-safety governor,  
68 Governor Ivey has achieved generational successes in the  
69 area of public safety, including the construction of new  
70 prisons in Elmore and Escambia Counties to replace the  
71 state's aging prison infrastructure, the restructuring of  
72 the Alabama Board of Pardons and Paroles, a top-to-bottom  
73 review of execution procedures, the establishment of a Metro  
74 Area Crime Suppression Unit to bolster police in our Capital  
75 City, and passage of the 2025 Safe Alabama legislative  
76 package, which among other things included enhanced legal  
77 protections for law enforcement officers; and

78 WHEREAS, Governor Ivey has also worked quietly but  
79 persistently to ensure good government in Alabama, from  
80 dissolving unnecessary state task forces, banning the  
81 appointment of lobbyists to executive-branch positions, and  
82 ending the misuse of local inmate food funds to successfully  
83 navigating the COVID-19 pandemic (and some 33 other states  
84 of emergency), overseeing 10 consecutive budgets without

85 proration, requiring state agencies to maintain their public  
86 funds in the State Treasury, improving accountability of  
87 state-vehicle use, and enhancing state agencies'  
88 responsiveness to public-records requests; and

89 WHEREAS, throughout it all, Governor Ivey has always,  
90 always, always reflected Alabama values, from the right to  
91 life, protection of children, and promotion of religious  
92 liberty to good, old-fashioned hard work, Southern  
93 hospitality, common sense, decency, and respect for others;  
94 and

95 WHEREAS, there truly is no step too high for our most  
96 celebrated and most loved "high-stepper," Governor Kay Ellen  
97 Ivey; now therefore,

98 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF ALABAMA, BOTH  
99 HOUSES THEREOF CONCURRING, That to honor Governor Ivey, who  
100 has loved her state and served it so well, the Alabama  
101 Building Renovation Finance Authority is strongly encouraged  
102 to designate the State of Alabama office building located at  
103 501 Washington Avenue in Montgomery the "Kay Ivey Office  
104 Building," to sit in parallel to the state office building  
105 named for her political inspiration, Lurleen B. Wallace, and  
106 to stand as an enduring marker of our admiration and respect  
107 for her successful tenure as Alabama's Chief Executive.

108 BE IT FURTHER RESOVLED, That the Alabama Building  
109 Renovation Finance Authority take all appropriate steps,  
110 consistent with applicable requirements and laws, to  
111 effectuate this designation, including by causing Governor  
112 Ivey's name to appear on the outside of the building, by

113 erecting all appropriate signs and markers, and by posting a  
114 framed copy of this resolution in a prominent location  
115 within the building lobby.
